## SECULAR CONTENT OF SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Schools shall not include prayer on the agenda of any school program. Any individual's right to pray is protected by the United States Constitution. The Board permits a moment of quiet reflection on the agenda of any school program, or a part of the school day. The purpose of any quiet reflection shall be non-religious. This policy neither requires nor prohibits individual prayer by students.

Subject to OCBE Policy 4035 regarding the development of curriculum, teachers are permitted to:

- 1. Teach about religion with the use of the Bible or other scripture, but without providing religious instruction, for the secular study of:
  - a) The history of religion;
  - b) Comparative religions;
  - c) The Bible as literature;
  - d) The role of religion in the history of the United States and other countries; and
  - e) Religious influences on art, music, literature, and social studies; and
- 2. Teach about religious holidays, including religious aspects, and celebrate the secular aspects of holidays.

No guest speaker shall appear in any school without prior approval of the principal.
